# Standard Specification for GALFAN (Zinc-5 % Aluminum-Mischmetal) Alloy in Ingot Form for Hot-Dip Coatings<sup>1,2</sup>

This standard is issued under the fixed designation B750; the number immediately following the designation indicates the year of original adoption or, in the case of revision, the year of last revision. A number in parentheses indicates the year of last reapproval. A superscript epsilon ( $\varepsilon$ ) indicates an editorial change since the last revision or reapproval.

## 1. Scope\*

1.1 This specification covers GALFAN, zinc-5 % aluminum-mischmetal (Zn-5Al-MM) alloy (UNS Z38510)<sup>3</sup> in ingot form for remelting for use in the production of hot-dip coatings on steel. Alloy composition is specified in Table 1.

1.2 The values stated in inch-pound units are to be regarded as standard. The values given in parentheses are mathematical conversions to SI units that are provided for information only and are not considered standard.

1.3 This standard does not purport to address all of the safety concerns, if any, associated with its use. It is the responsibility of the user of this standard to become familiar with all hazards including those identified in the appropriate Safety Data Sheet (SDS) for this product/material as provided by the manufacturer, to establish appropriate safety, health, and environmental practices, and determine the applicability of regulatory limitations prior to use.

1.4 This international standard was developed in accordance with internationally recognized principles on standardization established in the Decision on Principles for the Development of International Standards, Guides and Recommendations issued by the World Trade Organization Technical Barriers to Trade (TBT) Committee.

3.2.1 *mischmetal*, *n*—a naturally occurring mixture of rareearth elements in metallic form, primarily cerium and lanthanum.

<sup>A</sup> For purposes of acceptance and rejection, the observed value or calculated value obtained from analysis should be rounded to the nearest unit in the last right-hand place of figures, used in expressing the specified limit, in accordance with the rounding procedure prescribed in Section 3 of Practice E29.

<sup>B</sup> By agreement between purchaser and supplier, analysis may be required and limits established for elements or compounds not specified in the table of chemical composition.

<sup>C</sup> GALFAN, Zn-5Al-MM alloy ingot for hot-dip coatings may contain antimony, copper, and magnesium in amounts of up to 0.002, 0.1, and 0.05 %, respectively. No detrimental effects on alloy performance have ever been noted due to the presence of these elements up to these concentrations and, therefore, analyses are not required for these elements.

<sup>D</sup> Magnesium may be specified by the buyer up to 0.1 % maximum.

 $^{\it E}$  Zirconium and titanium may each be specified by the buyer up to 0.02 % maximum.

<sup>F</sup>Aluminum may be specified by the buyer up to 12 % maximum.

<sup>G</sup> Lead and cadmium, and to a lesser extent tin and antimony, are known to cause intergranular corrosion in zinc-aluminum alloys. For this reason it is important to maintain the levels of these elements below the limits specified.

### 6. Chemical Composition

6.1 *Limits*—The alloys shall conform to the requirements as to chemical composition prescribed in Table 1. Conformance shall be determined by the producer by analyzing samples taken at the time ingots are made. If the producer has determined the chemical composition of the metal during the course of manufacture, he shall not be required to sample and analyze the finished product.

### 8. Analytical Methods

8.1 *Method of Analysis*—The determination of chemical composition shall be made in accordance with ICP argon plasma spectrometric (Test Method E1277) or other methods (including spectrochemical methods ISO 3815-1 or ISO 3815-2. In case of dispute, the results secured by Test Method E1277 shall be the basis of acceptance.

8.2 A standard practice for X-ray fluorescence spectrometry for determination of cerium and lanthanum in a zinc-5 % aluminum alloy has been established by the International Lead Zinc Research Organization (Standard Practice GF-1). In case of dispute, the results secured by Test Method E1277 shall be the basis of acceptance.

### 10. Rejection and Rehearing

10.1 Material that fails to conform to the requirements of this specification may be rejected. Rejection should be reported to the producer or supplier promptly and in writing. In case of dissatisfaction with the results of the test, the producer or supplier may make claim for a rehearing. If the rehearing establishes that the material does not conform to the requirements of this specification, as much of the rejected original material as possible shall be returned to the producer or supplier.
