Corrections to the French version appear after the English text.

Les corrections à la version française sont données après le texte anglais.

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Replace the existing second item in the dashed list in 5.1 by the following:

Relative temperature coefficients ($\alpha_{\rm rel}$, $\beta_{\rm rel}$ and $\delta_{\rm rel}$) expressed in percentage per unit temperature (%/K or %/°C) can be determined by dividing the calculated value of temperature coefficients α , β , and δ by the values of short-circuit current, open-circuit voltage and maximum power respectively determined from the least squares fit at 25 °C corresponding to an irradiance of 1 000 W/m². The relative coefficients so determined are valid at the irradiance and spectrum at which the measurements were made. For linear PV devices with respect to irradiance (typically the case for c-Si), the relative temperature coefficient $\alpha_{\rm rel}$ is valid over the entire range of irradiance for which the device is linear according to IEC 60904-10, whereas the relative temperature coefficient $\beta_{\rm rel}$ scales with $f^2(G)$ (see Formula (7)).
