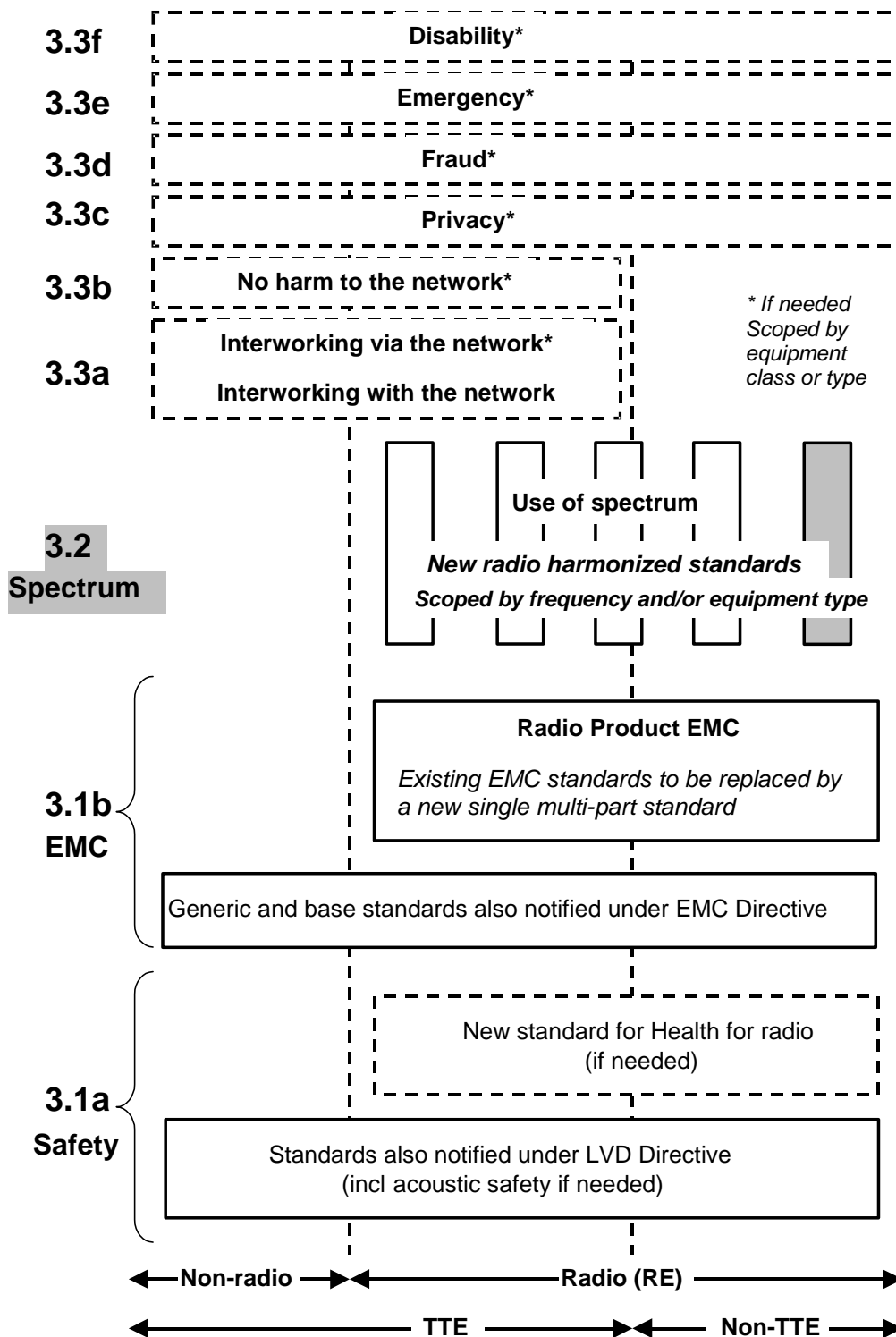


Figure 1: Modular structure for the various standards used under the R&TTE Directive

ETSI has designed a modular structure for the standards. Each standard is a module in the structure. The modular structure is shown in figure 1.
