An investigation by CENELEC TC 61 has shown that all risks from products within the scope of this standard are fully covered by the Low Voltage Directive, 73/23/EEC. For products having mechanical moving parts, a risk assessment in accordance with the Machinery Directive, 98/37/EC, has shown that the risks are mainly of electrical origin and consequently this directive is not applicable. However, the relevant essential safety requirements of the Machinery Directive are covered by this standard together with the principal objectives of the Low Voltage Directive.

6.101 France (Decree No. 97-617 of 30 May 1997)

> UV type 1 appliances are intended to be used in tanning salons, beauty parlours and similar premises, under supervision of appropriately trained persons.

UV type 3 appliances may be used by unskilled persons.

UV type 2 and UV type 4 appliances are intended to be used only following medical advice and under medical supervision.

UV type 1, UV type 2 and UV type 4 appliances cannot be sold to the public.

7.12 Finland (Decree of the Ministry of Social Affairs and Health on the Limitation of Public Exposure to Non-ionising Radiation (294/2002), 4.4.2002)

> The recommended number of exposures for each part of the body is to be based upon a maximum yearly dose of 5 kJ/m², weighted according to the UV action spectrum of Figure 101 and taking into account the recommended schedule of exposure.

32.101 France (Decree No. 97-617 of 30 May 1997)

> For UV type 1 and UV type 3 appliances, the irradiance in the range less than or equal to 320 nm, shall not exceed 1,5 % of the total UV irradiance of these appliances.

Spain (Real Decreto 1002/2002 of 27 September)

Users of UV appliances for household and similar use such as appliances intended to be used in tanning salons, beauty parlors and similar premises, cannot be exposed to ultraviolet radiation with

- a) effective irradiance above 0,30 W/m²;
 b) wavelengths shorter than 295 nm.

INTRODUCTION

It has been assumed in the drafting of this International Standard that the execution of its provisions is entrusted to appropriately qualified and experienced persons.

This standard recognizes the internationally accepted level of protection against hazards such as electrical, mechanical, thermal, fire and radiation of appliances when operated as in normal use taking into account the manufacturer's instructions. It also covers abnormal situations that can be expected in practice.

This standard takes into account the requirements of IEC 60364 as far as possible so that there is compatibility with the wiring rules when the appliance is connected to the supply mains. However, national wiring rules may differ.

If an appliance within the scope of this standard also incorporates functions that are covered by another part 2 of IEC 60335, the relevant part 2 is applied to each function separately, as far as is reasonable. If applicable, the influence of one function on the other is taken into account.

This standard is a product family standard dealing with the safety of appliances and takes precedence over horizontal and generic standards covering the same subject.

An appliance that complies with the text of this standard will not necessarily be considered to comply with the safety principles of the standard if, when examined and tested, it is found to have other features that impair the level of safety covered by these requirements.

An appliance employing materials or having forms of construction differing from those detailed in the requirements of this standard may be examined and tested according to the intent of the requirements and, if found to be substantially equivalent, may be considered to comply with the standard.
