Page 14, 6.4.6 Contact with chemicals: Code 286


Replace 6.4.6 with the following text:

#### "6.4.6 Contact or exposure to chemicals: Code 286

This subclause includes chemical reactions with chemicals and chemical products in various states—liquids, gases, fumes, vapours and solids, that can produce chemical reactions causing death, disability, injury or illness.

This group includes acids, alkalis, aromatics and hydrocarbon derivatives, halogens and their compounds, metallic dusts, powders and fumes, coal, natural gas, petroleum fuels and products."
